CHOOSING COURSES

Please follow the instructions in the right hand column and check off the courses you wish to take under the Student Choice column.

The courses chosen in Grade 10 determine the Grade 11 and Grade 12 courses that can be completed in the future and, therefore, determines the post-secondary programs/careers to which students may pursue. (EG: science 10 to biology 20 to biology 30 to nursing program or paramedic training).

Information about graduation or post-secondary requirements, can be researched through students' myBlueprint accounts and on the Oilfields' Student Services website.

<u>Choose courses carefully</u> because the timetable is created based on student choices. Once the schedule has been built, specific changes may be difficult to make, depending on where courses are offered in each semester. Selection of a course does not ensure it will fit it into a student's schedule, although every attempt will be made to accommodate student choices.

- Grade 10 classes are pre-requisite courses for going into grade 11.
- CALM/CTR and Physical Education 10 are mandatory for graduation. They are already checked off on the form.
- Select at least 5 option classes and numbered them (#1 being your top choice) to ensure timetable change flexibility. We will do our best to accommodate your top choices.
- Spares are offered in grade 12 only.
